We are proud that FSDB is nationally recognized as a trusted resource for the education of students who are deaf/hard of hearing, blind/visually impaired or deafblind. Our campus of more than 80 acres in historic St. Augustine features a Montessori-based pre-K school and five K-12 schools including access to virtual classes and dual enrollment opportunities. FSDB also offers statewide parent-infant and family support services across the state of Florida in addition to educational outreach and training services.

What truly sets FSDB apart from other schools – and why parents/guardians choose FSDB – are our highly qualified teachers, specialists and staff members, small class sizes, advanced technologies, specialized support services and much more.

Academic programs at FSDB are based on the Florida Standards, and students work toward the attainment of their standard diploma. In a typical academic year, career and technical education courses are offered both on-campus as well as off-campus through partnerships with postsecondary schools and businesses. Students also have opportunities to take part in a wide array of extracurricular, performing arts, and recreational activities including academic and athletic competitions.


FSDB is committed to carrying out its mission with emphasis on high-quality education, diversity, integrity and respect, safety and security, and innovation.

FSDB operates under the direction of its board of trustees, appointed by the Florida governor and confirmed by the state Senate. The FSDB president reports to the board; serves as the educational leader of the school; and is responsible for the organization, operation, and management of the school and its programs and services.

FSDB is accredited by AdvancED (now known as Cognia) and the Conference of Educational Administrators of Schools and Programs for the Deaf (CEASD).

Parent Infant Program

The FSDB Parent Infant Program offers statewide early intervention, family-centered opportunities free of charge for children ages 0-5. A specialized team of trained professionals—who serve as parent advisors—provide individualized services in the family’s home and during daily routines, in the child’s natural environment.

The FSDB curriculum is aligned to Florida Standards, Next Generation Sunshine State Standards, Florida Access Points; geared toward student attainment of standard diplomas upon graduation. High-quality instructional materials follow the same adoption schedule as all other Florida school districts. Students at FSDB benefit from barrier-free access to these materials and the resultant instructional opportunities.

Student-centered experiences at FSDB are designed to foster intellectual curiosity, nurture personal growth, encourage creative exploration and inspire a lifelong love of learning.

As students progress through FSDB K-12 schools, they learn to read actively, to write clearly, to think critically, to engage in meaningful dialogue and to act responsibly in today's changing world. Students also learn from each other, grow together and are a part of a dynamic and vibrant educational community.

Small class sizes, dual-certified teachers, standards-based curriculum, individualized instruction, specialized professional services, and advanced technologies at FSDB create a strong foundation for student achievement.

What makes FSDB different from other educational programs is full access to world-class knowledge through language acquisition, development, and mastery. Students who are deaf or hard of hearing benefit from American Sign Language and English instruction. Students who are blind or visually impaired benefit from audio, braille, and large print instruction.



Career development at FSDB begins early; elementary students explore and gain exposure to the world of work. 




Your Home Away from Home



Students in the FSDB boarding program benefit from a comfortable environment that serves as their home away from home. Boarding personnel are teachers, mentors, advisors, and surrogate family members. Boarding students learn the life skills essential for a successful transition to the adult world of independent living, employment, postsecondary education, and community involvement. Students also engage in recreational and leisure activities after school and during evening hours.

FSDB provides transportation services free of charge for day and boarding students. Local students who live in St. Augustine and surrounding areas go home daily. Students who live throughout the state travel home every Friday and return to school on Sunday.


